Judging Criteria

- 1. THROUGHLINE
 - a. Include a central theme that permeates the entire story from beginning to end.
 - b. Make sure each sentence logically links and makes sense with the last sentence. When in doubt, ask a friend.
 - c. Mechanically sound: outside editing is encouraged.
- 2. SHOW DON'T TELL
 - a. Help us see what you have experienced through illustrative words and vivid visuals.
- 3. SWIM TRUNK PRINCIPLE
 - a. Keep it short, cover what you need to. While beautiful words are essential to storytelling, multiplying words unnecessarily will take away from the power of your story.
 - b. 300 500 word limit.
- 4. ENTHUSIASM
 - a. A good story evokes emotion. Let us see your passion for BYU Law.
- 5. IMPACT
 - a. What impact has BYU Law had on your life? What impact have you had on others as a result of your participation with BYU Law?

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
